DANIELS—BRUMMETT

A very quiet wedding took place at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Edd Daniels Wednesday, Dec. 24th, when they gave their daughter, Miss Pansy, in marriage, to Mr. James B. Brummett of Wharton.

Miss Pansy has a host of friends at Giddings, to many of whom this came as a surprise, as it was not generally known that she was even receiving the attention of Mr. Brummett. But it now appears that she has waited all these months for his return from action in France.

Mr. Brummett won the Distinguished Service Medal for bravery in service. He was in the Marine Machine Gun service and held the enemy in check at Thiancourt, France, thus preventing a flanking movement. He also carried many dispatches under heavy bombardment, for all of which Gen. Pershing cited him for bravery. He saw 20 months active service in France with the Marine, which means that he was in the thickest of the fight—at one time being one of but a few from his command to return from action.

The wedding took place Wednesday afternoon at three o'clock, at the home of the bride's parents, Rev. W. W. Barr officiating.

On Christmas day the young folks returned to their future home in Wharton County.
