STANGE - DOMASCHK

The marriage of Miss Mildred Louise Domaschk, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. A. B. Domaschk, to Raymond Stange, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. H. Stange of Victoria, was solemnized at 1:30 p. m. Saturday at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in a double-ring ceremony performed by Rev. W. W. Sratmann.

The church was decorated with palms and white asters and gladioli, and the wedding music was played by Mrs. T. W. Whitmarsh, Jr. Mrs. Ward Dillard sang the bridal solos "At Dawning" and "Until."

The bride wore a princess gown of white organdy over ruffling down the front length of her frock. Her finger-tip veil was caught to a headdress of tulle folds and orange blossoms, and she carried a bouquet of white stephanotis and gladioli. Her sister, Dorothy Domaschk, was maid of honor, gowned in pink organdy over taffeta. Miss Marie Stange, sister of the groom, and Miss Marguerite Schneider of Giddings as bridesmaids, were in similar bouffant frocks of blue, and the junior bridesmaid, Bertha Agnes Domaschk wore pink. Their flowers were gladioli in hues harmonizing with their gowns.

James Brown served as best man, and the groomsmen were Louis Domaschk, brother of the bride, and Ernest Spiegelhauser of Victoria.

A reception for relatives and out-of-town guests was held at the Domaschk home after the ceremony. The three-tiered

wedding cake centered the bride's table and her bouquet was placed on a mirror at one end of the candle-lighted board. Assisting in the house party were Mrs. Martin Kleschnick, Mrs. Whitmarsh and Miss Bonnie Gardner.
