Qualls-Urban Vows Told in Austin

The Rev. A. E. Graf performed the double ceremony before arrangements of daisies, asters, and zinnias.

The traditional wedding music was played by A. E. Koepsoll who also accompanied Miss Jeanette Urban as she sang "The Lord is My Shepard" and the congregation as they sang "O Perfect Love."

The bride, given in marriage by her father, wore a ballerina length gown of white embroidered organdy fashioned with fitted bodice and sweetheart neckline. She wore white lace mitts. Her shoulder length veil of nylon net was held in place by small organdy flowers. She carried a white prayer book overlaid with two gardenias and her satin streamers were knotted with tiny carnations. Her only jewelry was a double-strand of pearls, a gift of the bridegroom.

Mrs. Melvin Loewe of Giddings, sister of the bridegroom, served as matron of honor. She wore blue net over moir taffeta, with matching headdress and carried a pastel shaded flower nosegay.

Miss Clara Belle Qualls, sister of the bride, was bridesmaid. Her gown was of pink net over moir taffeta, also with matching headdress and nosegay.

Melvin Loewe was best man and Robert Qualls of Lexington served as groomsman. Ushers were Clarence Michalk and Monroe Domann of Austin.

The mother of the bride wore navy blue crepe with accessories, while the bridegroom's mother wore grey rayon crepe with black accessories. Both wore white aster corsages.

For the wedding trip to New Mexico, the bride chose a pink linen suit with navy accessories. Two gardenias were her corsage.
