Second Lieutenant Dalton transfered to the war zone on William Hielscher Sr. wounded in action on December 1, 1950, in the Korean Area in the performance of his duty, his family was informed Sunday by a telegram signed by General C. B. Cates, Commandant of the United States Marine Corps.
