

April 1 Is School Election Day

Saturday, April 1 is trustee election day in the common and independent school districts of the county.

Common school trustees are to be elected in each of the common school districts in the county and in the independent school districts of Giddings and Lexington. The number of trustees to be elected in the common school districts is one for each district except Tanglewood, Dime Box, and Post Oak where the number is two, seven, and three, respectively.

County trustees are to be elected in Commissioners Precincts 1 and 2. The terms of Herbert Wachsmann in Precinct 1 and C. A. Hamff in Precinct 2 expire this year. Both men are up for re-election.

The terms of John Longley, M. Y. Tate, and R. W. Namken, trustees in the Giddings Independent School District expire this year. All three men have filed for re-election.

In the Lexington Independent School District the terms of Robert Woods and Milton Sorenson expire this year. Mr. Sorenson is a candidate for re-election while Lexington School officials said that Mr. Woods was not seeking another term. Alva Watson has filed for a place on the ballot in the Lexington district.

A peculiar condition has arisen in the Dime Box Rural High School District where a complete slate of seven trustees will have to be elected.

A state school law provides that in the event of a consolida-

tion or annexation in school districts other than independent districts all qualified voters of the newly-formed district must have the opportunity of voting for the complete slate of trustees to serve the district. In the case of the Dime Box district the county board annexed the common districts of Gloyna and Loebau to the Dime Box district. All of the seven trustees at Dime Box whose terms expire

have filed for re-election.

Deadline for filing for a position on the ballot passed last Tuesday, March 21.
