7 August 1937

Dear Volksblatt!

My girlfriend, Mrs. Otto Kieschnick, sent me the Giddings newspaper every week. Today we read that other people also travel and have good times and take advantage of medical help. Well, dear friend L.K. in Winchester, you want to know where I am now. To write everything is too much. On May 10 I went to Bishop to a hospital. A naturopathic doctor is treating me; his name is Dr. Edwin M. Sargent. His address: Box 211, Bishop, Texas. Should anyone be interested in finding help, please keep this name and address.

On June 22 I went to Giddings; from there to my son Otto and family in Eola. On July 1 I went to Abilene to the city hospital. On July 2, I took my son Henry with me to the Herman Droemers in Grassyville. On July 7 my son Herman brought me and Henry here. The doctor is also treating him. If it is God's will, we will leave on the bus from Bishop tomorrow evening at 10:00 o'clock and drive to Giddings. I do not know yet if we need to come back here.

The doctor helped us a lot. I could not hear with my left ear for 22 years and now I can hear again. My cough is cured also. The cramps in my legs are gone too. My tongue does not hurt anymore either. Enough now for today; to conclude, greetings to everyone.
